



Using EMMA® Trade Monitor Instructional Guide

The Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board's <u>Electronic Municipal Market Access (EMMA®)</u> website features a no-cost resource that allows state and local governments to quickly and easily download into a spreadsheet key data on the price, yield and amount of secondary market trade activity of their municipal bonds. The EMMA Trade Monitor provides state and local governments with the capability to analyze data from the EMMA website in support of, among other things, evaluating pricing for new issues. Trade Monitor provides trade activity and data on trades occurring since January 2005.



Organization Accounts

Using EMMA Trade Monitor


1. Log in to the EMMA website, at emma.msrb.org, and click the EMMA Dataport tab. Click on "Login" and you will be transferred to the MSRB Gateway secure portal.






Subscribe to issuer education and EMMA email updates from the MSRB.

2. Enter your organization account user ID and password and click "Login." You will be brought to the EMMA Dataport submission page.




3. From EMMA Dataport, choose the Export Secondary Market Trade Data link.





4. Enter any CUSIP-6 or CUSIP-9 to search for trade data that you wish to export. Real-time trade data is available from January 2005 through the current date, but multi-day trade searches may not span more than one year. You can include up to 10 CUSIP-6s or 100 CUSIP-9s in one search. After you have set your search parameters, accept the MSRB's terms and conditions and click "Search & Export" to generate a .CSV file.



5. The .CSV file can be opened in Notepad or in Excel. The first line of this document lists your search criteria and the following rows list the data you requested. A sample export is shown below.
